The Protective Security Coordination Centre (PSCC), a Division of the Attorney-General's Department, is hosting the 18th Security In Government (SIG) Conference, to be held in Canberra's National Convention Centre from 10 to 12 May 2005. The PSCC has wide-ranging protective security responsibilities for:

- the development, maintenance and coordination of Australia's national counter-terrorism capabilities
- the coordination of Australia's national crisis management arrangements in response to a threat or act of terrorism
- the coordination of protection arrangements for at-risk persons, premises and facilities including Australian Government Ministers, visiting foreign dignitaries and the foreign diplomatic and consular community in Australia
- the development and promotion of protective security policy, advice and common standards and practices
- the provision of protective, physical, information technology and personnel security training to Australian Government personnel, and
- security vetting.

SIG continues to be the largest conference of its type in Australia with delegates including agency security advisers from many Australian Government agencies. SIG 2005 aims to expand representation across all levels of government as well as the private sector. The conference and trade exhibition will highlight the latest developments in policy and technology in the protective security environment.

Your attendance at SIG 2005 will enable you to engage with public and private sector security experts from a range of fields. The SIG 2005 trade exhibition will provide you with the opportunity to meet over 80 security related service providers who work closely with government and the private sector to provide innovative solutions to security problems.
