

Dear Sir,

I'm writing to oppose any changes to the Anti-discrimination law, or to extend its reach.

All such legislation removed freedom of choice. We already have the Equal opportunity Commission to deal with discrimination.

It is not necessary to have a law based on sex and gender identity. The proposed change will adversely affect freedom of choice and religion which are so basic to our democracy.

This has already been seen by the unfair cases that have been brought eg against the CYC Camp at Phillip Island, and the Wesley Mission. This law seems to be put in place to discriminate against Christians, by a small vocal minority. It is not good to give an open door to these folk to use a law against others whose faith they disagree with.
