

I submit that there should be no addition to the anti-discrimination act in respect to sexuality and gender identity.

The facts are, in principle, individual homosexuals are not discriminated against. They have the same rights as any heterosexual individual. Only as couples are they discriminated against. Here are my reasons for why this discrimination ought to continue...

1. They cannot reproduce, therefore, nature discriminates against them.
2. They will harm society. Gay marriage is an open door to adoption/ivf rights to Gay couples which will discriminate against children who have the right to be brought up in a balanced way by a father and a mother.
